15	2 classified state employee, for those days during which the		
16	legislature is in session. The president of the senate and		
17	the speaker of the house shall receive an additional \$5 a		
18	day in salary for those days during which the legislature is		
19	in session.		
20	(2) Legislators are entitled to \$40 a day, 7 days a		
21	week, during a legislative session, as reimbursement for		
22	expenses incurred in attending a session. Expense payments		
23	shall stop when the legislature recesses for more than 3		
24	days and shall resume when the legislature reconvenes.		
25	(3) Legislators are entitled to a mileage allowance as		

1 provided in 2-18-503 for each mile of travel:

2 (a) to the place of the holding of the session and to
3 return to their place of residence at the conclusion of the
4 session; and

5 (b) for one additional round trip to their place of
6 residence during each session.

7 (4) Legislators are not entitled to any additional
8 mileage allowance under subsection (3)(a) or (3)(b) for a
9 special session if it is convened within 7 days of a regular
10 session."
