DESCRIPTION

This proposed bill clarifies and revises the coal severance tax allocations for acquisition of state parks, recreation areas, monuments, and historical sites and for grants for cultural and aesthetic projects; requiring that the legislature must approve each purchase or grant.

ASSUMPTIONS

- 1) The Department of Revenue projections for coal severance tax of \$49.093 M in FY 80 and \$54.272 in FY 81 are correct.
- 2) Coal tax collections are homogeneous. (One quarter of estimated yearly collections is collected each quarter.

TECHNICAL NOTE

Page 2, line 22 and page 3, line 14 each propose changes in the allocation of coal tax receipts received prior to June 30, 1979; however, without an effective date, the proposed law would not take effect until July 1, 1979.
