Tagene V Zalange 6 7 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: Section 1. Definitions. As used in [this act], the 9 following definitions apply: 10 (1) "Customer" means a person who purchases repair 11 service for household appliances or a motor vehicle. 12 (2) "Motor vehicle" means a vehicle as defined in 13 14 61-1-102. (3) "Notor vehicle repair business" means a person 15 who, for compensation, engages in the business of repairing, 16 17 servicing, or maintaining motor vehicles owned by other persons. The term includes but is not limited to new and 18 19 used motor vehicle dealers, garages, service stations, self-employed individuals, truck stops, paint and body 20 shops, brake, muffler, or transmission shops, and other 21 22 specialty shops.

(4) "Household appliances" means goods and appliances
used primarily within the home. The term includes but is not
limited to washing machines, dryers, televisions,

1 refrigerators, stoves, and small electrical appliances.

2 (5) "Household appliance repair business" means any
3 person who, for compensation, engages in the business of
4 repairing household appliances.

Section 2. Repair of household appliances and motor vehicles — return of replaced parts. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2). upon the request of the customer at the time the work order is taken to repair household appliances or motor vehicles. the household appliance repair business or motor vehicle repair business shall return replaced parts to the customer upon the completion of the work.

12 (2) A household appliance repair business or motor
13 vehicle repair business is not required to return a replaced
14 part if:

15 (a) it is impracticable because of size or weight;

16 (b) the household appliance repair business or motor 17 vehicle repair business is required to return the part to 18 the manufacturer, distributor, or other supplier under a 19 warranty arrangement or exchanged parts program; or

20 (c) there is no charge for the replacement part.

(3) If such part is not required to be returned under subsection (2), then the household appliance repair business or motor vehicle repair business shall give the customer opportunity to see the damaged part if the customer requested such opportunity at the time the work order was
