submitted a Fiscal Note for House Bill 572 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana,
1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing
this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members
of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION:

This proposed bill provides that grain merchandisers are exempt from state store licensing requirements.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. There will be 150 grain merchandisers subject to the state wholesale store license in both FY80 and FY81.
- 2. A wholesale store license will cost \$43.50 per unit.
- 3. The first \$5 of the license goes to the Department of Business Regulation account, with the remainder going to the General Fund.
- 4. No change in administrative costs.
