In compliance with a written request received <u>March 8, 1979</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>House Bill 590</u> pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act providing for an increase in licensing or registration and inspection fees for persons warehousing beans, for apiaries, and for nurserymen.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Fee increases will be effective for nursery licenses, seasonal nurserymen, and bean warehouse licenses July 1, 1979.
- 2. Fee increases for apiary registrations and fees will be effective May 1, 1980.
- 3. Apiary related fees are based on FY 1978 registrations and certificates issued.
- 4. Necessary travel expenses and per diem will be paid by the persons requesting inspections.
- 5. The attached amendments will be adopted.
