A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO INCREASE THE SERVICE
RETIREMENT ALLUMANCE OF A MEMBER OF THE MONTANA HIGHWAY

PATROLMEN'S RETIREMENT SYSTEM WHO RETIRES AFTER JUNE 30,

1979, WITH MORE THAN 25 YEARS OF SERVICE; AMENDING SECTION

8 19-6-502, MCA."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 19-6-502, MCA, is amended to read:
#19-6-502. Service retirement allowance. (1) Upon
retirement from service a member shall receive a service
retirement allowance which shall consist of the state
annuity plus the member's annuity.

- (2) The service retirement allowance shall be computed as follows:
- 18 (a) 20 through 25 years, 2% of his final salary for each year of service;
- 20 (b) over 25 years, for a member who retired before
 21 <u>July 1. 1979.</u> 2% of his final salary for each year of
 22 service through the 25th plus 1% of his final salary for
 23 each year of service past 25*:
- 24 (c) over 25 years: for a sember who retires after June
 25 30: 1979: 23 of his final salary for each year of service

- 1 through the 25th plus 3% of his final salary for each year
- of service past 25, up to a maximum of 75% of his final
- 3 salary."

- Description of proposed legislation: This legislation increases the retirement allowance available to highway patrolmen who would elect to serve over 25 years as a patrolman.
- Assumption:1) It is assumed 10% of the patrolmen would elect to use their provision to enhance their retirement benefit.
 - (2) There is a 6% salary increase in FY 1981

Fiscal Impact: The cost to the fund would be approximately \$50,240 in FY 1980 and \$53,245 in FY 1981, or 1.52% of salary per year over the next 40 years. There is no funding provided in this bill.
