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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE POLLS TO BE OPEN FROM NOON UNTIL 8 P.M. FOR ORAINAGE DISTRICT ELECTIONS: AMENDING SECTION 85-8-304. MCA.\*

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BE IT ENACYED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 85-8-304. MCA. is amended to read: #85-8-304. Conduction of election. Any judge election may administer any path required to be administered during the progress of an election. Before the opening of the polls the judges of election must take and subscribe an oath to faithfully perform the duties imposed upon them by law, and such eath may be administered by any elector. The polls shall open at 12 noon and be kept open until 5 8 p.m.. when the same shall be closed. Such elections shall be conducted, except as herein otherwise provided, as nearly as practicable in accordance with the provisions of the general election laws of the state, except that no registration shall be required. As soon as the polls are closed the judges shall count and tabulate the votes cast and make out a certificate, to be signed by them, showing the total number of votes cast at the election and the total number cast for each candidate for commissioner and shall deliver

such certificate, with a list of the electors voting at such election, to the board of commissioners. Such board of commissioners shall meet on the first Honday following such election and canvass such returns. The board shall declare elected the person or persons receiving the highest number of votes. The clerk of the board of directors shall enter the result of such canvass in the minutes of the board and file with the clerk of the district court creating the district a statement showing the names of the persons 10 elected as commissioners, the names of the commissioners 11 whose term will expire on the first Tuesday in May 12 following, and the names of all of the persons who will 13 compose the board of directors for the year next following 14 the first Tuesday in May."
