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INTRODUCED BY CUSTISS ROTA MAN A STATE FORM A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MOMEY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND CONSERVATION FROM THE RENEWABLE RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT CLEARANCE FUND ACCOUNT FOR EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE IN REPLACEMENT OF THE ST. CLAIR CREEK SYPHON IN THE GLEN LAKE IRRIGATION DISTRICT."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Appropriation. An amount of \$400,000 is appropriated to the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation from the renewable resource development clearance fund account created within the bond proceeds and insurance clearance fund established in 17-2-102 to be used for a grant to the Glen Lake irrigation district for the purpose of replacing the St. Clair Creek Syphon, notwithstanding any provision of law that would otherwise prohibit a renewable resource development grant to an irrigation district. The grant is to be administered under the renewable resource development program and must be made before the fiscal year ending June 30, 1981, or the money will revert to the renewable resource development clearance fund account. Upon an application for the grant by the Glen Lake irrigation district, the Department of Natural

grant provided all conditions have been met. Any funds not so used must be returned to the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation for deposit into the renewable resource development clearance fund account. Section 2. Conditions of the grant. Disbursement of funds under this act shall be made only after: (1) the project has been authorized by other financial sponsors, if any: 10 (2) initial funding from other sources, if any, has 11 been committed for construction; and 12 (3) an agreement between the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation and the applicant has been 13 14 executed governing the administration and disposal of funds.
