BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Appropriations. The following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to Montana State University for the purpose of establishing and offering a cooperative veterinary educational program for selected fourth-year veterinary students that will concentrate primarily on food animal medicine as applied to beef cattle cow-calf operations:

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 752 is an act to appropriate money to Montana State University for the purpose of establishing and offering a cooperative veterinary educational program for fourth-year students.

Assumptions

- *1) It is assumed that 30 AY FTE students will participate in the program. The training would be for a period of 4 to 12 weeks and total credit hours during the year would amount to 30 AY FTE students.
 - 2) Fifty percent of the students will be paying fees of \$9,558.92 per AY FTE student, and 50 percent will be students from other colleges on a trade-off basis.
