In 24 25 addition the driver of a vehicle must slow and proceed with caution when meeting or overtaking from either direction any
 school bus which is preparing to stop on the highway or
 street for the purpose of receiving or discharging any
 school children as indicated by flashing amber lights as
 specified in 61-9-402.
