(b) make loans to persons to whom telephone service is or will be supplied by the cooperative for the purpose of and otherwise to assist such persons in wiring their premises for telephone service and installing therein telephone fixtures, appliances, apparatus, and equipment of any and all kinds and character and, in connection therewith, purchase, acquire, lease, sell, distribute, install, and repair such telephone fixtures, appliances, apparatus, and equipment and accept or otherwise acquire and sell, assign, transfer, endorse, pledge, hypothecate, and otherwise dispose of notes, bonds, and other evidences of indebtedness and any and all types of security therefor;

(14) do and perform any and all other acts and things and have and exercise any and all other powers which may be necessary, convenient, or appropriate to accomplish the purpose for which the cooperative is organized.
