45-12-301. Office of legislative fiscal analyst. [1]

There is an office of legislative fiscal analyst. The

legislative fiscal analyst shall carry out the provisions of

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this chapter.

(2) The legislative fiscal analyst is responsible solely to the legislature. He shall hold office for a term of 2 years beginning July 1 of each odd-numbered year. The committee may remove him for misfeasance, malfeasance, or nonfeasance in office at any time after notice and bearing."

Section 5. Section 5-12-302, NCA, is amended to read:

"5-12-302. Fiscal analyst's duties. The legislative fiscal analyst shall:

- (1) provide for fiscal analysis of state government and accumulate, compile, analyze, and furnish such information bearing upon the financial matters of the state that-is-relevant-to-issues-of-policy-end-questions-of statewide--importance, including but not limited to investigation and study of the possibilities of effecting economy and efficiency in state government;
  - (2) estimate revenue from existing and proposed taxes;
- (3) analyze the executive budget and budget requests of selected state agencies and institutions, including proposals for the construction of capital improvements:
- (4) make the reports and-recommendations-he-deems desirable-to-the-legislature--and--make--reports--and recommendations--as requested by the legislative finance committee and the legislature; and
  - (5) assist committees of the legislature and

1 individual legislators in compiling and analyzing financial
2 information.\*\*

Section 6. Section 5-12-303. MCA, is amended to read:

"5-12-303. Fiscal analysis information from state agencies. (1) The legislative fiscal analyst has---the authority--to may under the direction of the committee investigate and examine the costs of state government activities and may examine the records, books, and files of any state agency, including confidential records of executive branch agencies.

- (2) Every state agency shall furnish the legislative fiscal analyst with copies of all budget requests, at the time of submission to the budget director as provided by law, and if requested, all underlying and supporting documentation.
- (3) In the year preceding each legislative session, the budget director shall furnish the legislative fiscal analyst on a confidential basis:
- 19 (a) by December 1, a copy of the documents which
  20 reflect the anticipated receipts and other means of
  21 financing the budget for each fiscal year of the ensuing
  22 biennium:
- 23 (b) by December 1, a preliminary budget which shall 24 meet the statutory requirements for submission of the budget 25 to the legislature; and

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(c) by December 15, all amendments to the preliminary 1 2 budget."

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NEW SECTION. Section To Recommendations of fiscal analyst. The reports of the fiscal analyst may include comments, recommendations, and suggestions, but he may not otherwise influence or direct executive or legislative action.

Section 8. Section 5-12-402. MCA, is amended to read: \*5-12-402. Review by legislative fiscal analyst. The legislative fiscal analyst shall review proposed budget amendments submitted to the committee from the budget director and make-recommendations present an analysis to the committee concerning the fiscal implications of the proposed budget amendments."

NEW SECTION. Section 9. Standards and objectives for fiscal analysis. (1) The objective of an analysis conducted by the legislative fiscal analyst under 5-12-302(2) and 5-12-203(3) is to provide an independent determination of whether agency budgets, budget amendments, fiscal notes, revenue projections, and related fiscal projections and estimates are based upon reasonably sound assumptions and have been derived through sound estimating techniques. An analysis should indicate:

(a) whether a proposed budget provides a reasonable basis for implementing policies and programs that have been

authorized by the legislature or are proposed to be authorized by the legislature should they be pursued with efficiency and effectiveness;

- (b) whether each assumption used in developing a is reasonable and, if not, what alternate assumption should be accepted and the basis for its validity:
- (c) whether the estimation technique used in making a projection is valid and, if not, what alternative technique would be valid and the basis for its validity; and
- (d) the alternate fiscal projection calculated by the analyst based upon the alternatives identified in the analysis required by subsections (a) through (c).
- (2) In providing reports and assistance to the committee, the legislature, and individual legislators under 5-12-302(4) and 5-12-302(5), analysis must be based to the extent possible upon stated assumptions and techniques.
