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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REVISING THE INTERIM COMMITTE STRUCTURE OF THE LEGISLATURE; AUTHORIZING EXPANDED FUNCTIONS FOR LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEES; REVISING THE INTERIM AUMINISTRATIVE REVIEW AND STUDY PROCESS; PROVIDING FOR COMMITTEE SUPPORT THROUGH THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND ASSISTANCE FRUM OTHER COMMITTEES; AMENDING SECTIONS 5-2-202, 5-2-302, 5-5-202, 5-5-211, 5-5-213, 5-5-215, 5-5-216, AND 5-11-105, NCA.*

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NHEREAS, the lagislature finds itself currently directing the operation of a state government with budget requirements in excess of \$1 billion and that employs approximately 7,000 persons; and

WHEREAS, the potential for development of the state's mineral and timber reserves as well as the great likelihood for growth in our agriculture and business communities in the future also tends to create a potential for growth in the size and complexity of government; and

MHEREAS: in order to adequately represent the people of Montana and to obtain sufficient information to set policy and guide its implementation: a new capacity for legislative oversight and policy study must by developed.
