BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this joint resolution be sent by the Secretary of State to the President of the United States Senate, the Secretary of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the Clerk of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Montana Congressional delegation attesting the adoption of this joint resolution by the 46th Legislature of the state of Montana.
