That the Montana Senate and House of Representatives,

through this joint resolution, apply to the United States

Congress to call a convention for the sole and exclusive

purpose of proposing an amendment to the United States

Constitution that would protect the lives of all human

beings including unborn children at every stage of their

biological development.

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this application
2 constitutes a continuing application for such a convention
3 pursuant to Article V of the United States Constitution
4 until the legislatures of two-thirds of the states have made
5 like applications and the convention has been called by the
6 United States Congress.

7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this joint
8 resolution be sent by the Secretary of State to the
9 President of the United States Senate, the Secretary of the
10 United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House
11 of Representatives, the Clerk of the United States House of
12 Representatives, and to each member of the Montana
13 Congressional delegation attesting the adoption of this
14 joint resolution by the 46th Legislature of the state of
15 Montana.
