NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

That President Carter is strongly encouraged to seek adequate funding for federally subsidized housing programs under the Department of Housing and Urban Development so that poor citizens of Montana may attain the national goal of decent, safe, and sanitary housing.
