- (2) encourage pride in individual human industry and initiative by employing Montana labor in meaningful labor and aiding Montana citizens to form their own businesses; and
 - (3) preserve Montana's excellent environment.
- To further the purposes of this study, the committee may accept funds from any public or private source.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all state agencies, the units of the Montana University System, the office of the Governor, and the staff of the Legislative Council make all their resources available to the committee for use in this study.
