WHEREAS, travel within these states frequently requires
driving for long distances through sparsely settled country
with little traffic; and

14 NHEREAS, the 55-mile-per-hour conservation speed limit
 15 does not provide for significant fuel savings; and

16 WHEREAS, many motor vehicles do not operate efficiently 17 at 55 miles per hour but could be operated efficiently and 18 safely at higher speeds; and

19 WHEREAS, a higher maximum speed limit in areas of
20 sparse population and low traffic density would facilitate
21 travel, reduce driver fatigue, improve vehicle efficiency,
22 and not adversely affect the nation's fuel consumption.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

1 That the Congress of the United States is urged to take 2 immediate action to amend the Emergency Highway Energy 3 Conservation Act to permit states to raise the maximum speed 4 limit to 65 miles per hour.

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State 6 send copies of this resolution to the President of the 7 United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House 8 of Representatives, and to each member of the Montana 9 Congressional Delegation.
