10 sovereign and legitimate government of the 17 million free
11 Chinese living there; and

12 WHEREAS, the Republic of China on Taiwan is a faithful
13 ally of the United States of America; and

14 WHEREAS, the Shanghai Communique signed in 1972 between
15 Chou En-Lai and Richard Nixon acknowledged that both Peking
16 and Taipei claim to be the legitimate government of all
17 China; and

18 WHEREAS, the Shanghai Communique did not preclude
19 diplomatic relations with both Taipei and Peking.

21 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
22 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

23 That President Carter is urged to establish official
24 government relations with the Republic of China and that the
