 5 MONTANA COMMEMORATING THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CITY OF
 6 BUTTE. *Manning Magom Reichel*

8 WHEREAS, Butte as a city was formally founded upon the
 9 "Richest Hill on Earth" by the passage and approval of a
 10 bill for incorporation introduced into the 1879 Montana
 11 Territorial Legislature by Joseph A. Hyde of Deer Lodge and
 12 signed by Governor B. F. Potts; and

13 WHEREAS, on Saturday, April 7, 1979, the city of Butte
 14 celebrates its 100th year as a city; and

15 WHEREAS, the history of Butte and the history of the
 16 state of Montana are intricately bound together; and

17 WHEREAS, Butte has had a rich and glorious mining
 18 history that brought together people of many ethnic groups
 19 who contributed to the cultural development of Montana; and

20 WHEREAS, these people developed a unique pride for
 21 their fellow citizens and their city, setting an example of
 22 hospitality and friendship and proclaiming this unique pride
 23 by calling itself "Butte, America"; and

24 WHEREAS, the mining corporations, the copper kings, and
 the miners of Butte contributed to the economic, political,

1 and character development of Montana; and
 2 WHEREAS, the rich and varied history of Butte has seen
 3 it pass from a boisterous frontier mining town to a mature
 4 source of raw materials building a nation at peace and
 5 defending a nation at war and now on to a community
 6 developing as the commercial crossroad of the Northern Rocky
 7 Mountains; and

8 WHEREAS, it is appropriate that the House of
 9 Representatives commemorate this occasion.

 11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
 12 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

13 (1) That the House of Representatives congratulates
 14 the great city of Butte on its 100th anniversary and wishes
 15 the city another 100 years of peace and prosperity.

16 (2) That the House of Representatives recognizes with
 17 appreciation the contribution the people of Butte have made
 18 to the development of the state and recognizes and commends
 19 those people for the strength of character and purpose that
 20 has made Butte a city of which Montana is indeed proud.

21 (3) That the Chief Clerk is directed to transmit a
 22 copy of this resolution to Governor Tom Judge to be
 23 presented to the people of Butte with the compliments of the
 24 House.
