WHEREAS, on Saturday, April 7, 1979, the city of Butte celebrates its 100th year as a city; and

WHEREAS, the history of Butte and the history of the state of Montana are intricately bound together; and

WHEREAS, Butte has had a rich and glorious mining history that brought together people of many ethnic groups who contributed to the cultural development of Montana; and

WHEREAS, these people developed a unique pride for their fellow citizens and their city, setting an example of hospitality and friendship and proclaiming this unique pride by calling itself "Butte, America"; and

WHEREAS, the mining corporations, the copper kings, and the miners of Butte contributed to the economic, political,
