In compliance with a written request received <u>January 25, 1979</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>Senate Bill 79</u> pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A proposal allowing the transfer of permanently valuable state records to the State Archives that are otherwise mandated to remain in the custody of the generating office; and to establish the authority of the State Archives to certify copies of the records housed in that facility.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Effective July 1, 1979, this act would transfer to the program an additional maximum of 1000 cubic feet of permanently valuable state records. This 1000 cubic feet maximum transfer per year is a reflection of the facility's work space capabilities, not a projection of the records which might be transferred under this act.

2. The present staff can handle the increased transfer of state records under this proposed law through some alteration in work priorities. Little or no travel would be required.

3. Citizens will be charged actual cost for requested copies.
