February 2, 1979	Committee recommend bill, do not pass (majority). (Minority recommend bill, do pass. Failed) On motion, Senate reconsider its action taken on Adverse Committee Report this Legislative Day. Motion adopted. On motion, ordered printed and placed on second reading.
February 3, 1979	Printed and placed on members' desks.
February 5, 1979	Second reading, indefinitely postponed.

 12 "2-15-1706. Commission for human rights -- allocation
 13 -- quasi-judicial. (1) There is a commission for human
 14 rights.

15 (2) The commission consists of five members appointed
 16 by the governor.

17 (3) The commission is designated as a quasi-judicial
 18 board for the purposes of 2-15-124.

19 (4) The commission is allocated to the department of
 20 labor and industry for administrative purposes only as
 21 provided in 2-15-121, ~~except that the commission may hire~~
 22 ~~its own personnel, may seek and receive private and federal~~
 23 ~~funds in its own name, and may determine all matters of~~
 24 ~~policy concerning the use of its budget.~~ Subsection (2)(d)
