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- (3) The committee shall serve as a long-range building committee to recommend to the legislature construction and remodeling priorities for the capital complex.
- Section 3. Report to legislature. The committee shall prepare a written report of its activities and recommendations and present the report to the legislature at each regular session. To prepare its report and recommendations, the committee may receive assistance from the legislative council.
- Section 4. Compensation and expenses. Legislative members are entitled to receive compensation and expenses as provided in 5-2-302 while engaged in committee business.
- Section 5. Repealer. Sections 1 through 4 of Chapter 19 232, Laws of Montana, 1971. section 25 of Chapter 326, Laws of Montana, 1974, and section 54 of Chapter 439. Laws of 21 Montana, 1975, are repealed.

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Section 2. Function of committee -- capitol area master plan. (1) The function of the committee is to establish and maintain a master plan for the orderly development of state buildings in the immediate area of the capital city. The master plan shall be developed and maintained with consideration given to the following factors:
