So much of that money on hand at any time as may be needed to pay highway bonds and interest thereon when due and to accumulate and maintain a reserve therefor, as provided in laws and in resolutions of the state board of examiners authorizing such bonds, shall be deposited in the highway bond account in the sinking fund established by 17-2-102. Subject to that provision, 9/10 of 1% of all money shall be deposited in the state park account and 3/10 6/10 of 1% of all money shall be deposited in a snowmobile

account in the earmarked revenue fund. In compliance with a written request received <u>January 22, 1979</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>Senate Bill 172</u> pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION

This bill increases the percentage of the receipts of the gasoline dealers' license tax to be deposited in the snowmobile account of the Earmarked Revenue Fund.
