BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Curriculum to include health hazards of
 marijuana. (1) Every public elementary and high school in
 the state of Montana shall include in its curriculum a
 course on the health hazards of marijuana (*Cannabis sativa*).
 The content of the course shall:

(a) be limited to the harmful physiological and
 psychological effects of the drug; and
 (b) be reviewed and approved by the board of trustees
 of each district before being offered for study.

(2) The provisions of this section do not prevent
 instruction as to the harmful physiological or psychological
 effects of other dangerous drugs.
