#### DESCRIPTION

This bill submits to the qualified electors of Montana a new section in the Montana Constitution placing a limit on the amount of property tax that could be collected in any year on certain property.

#### ASSUMPTIONS

There will be no fiscal impact, other than the cost of putting the initiative on the ballot, during FY 80 and FY 81.

### FISCAL IMPACT

#### LONG-RANGE EFFECTS

If this intiative were to be passed by the voters, the long range impact may be to hinder local government financing in a few high mill levy areas of the state.
