OF FEDERAL FOREST RESERVE MONEY TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS;

AMENDING SECTIONS 17-3-213 AND 20-9-331, MCA. LANGUE CONTROL OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9 Section 1. Section 17-3-213, MCA, is amended to read:

*17-3-213. Allocation to general fund and common section to general fund and common section to general fund and common section to section to general funds as so apportioned to each county shall be apportioned by the county treasurer in each county between the several funds as follows:

- (a) to the general road fund, 66 2/3% of the total amount received;
- (b) to-the-common-school fund to the various school districts and joint county school districts within the county, 33 1/3% of the total sum received in proportion to the average number belonging in each district in the year immediately prior to this distribution. The distribution of such money to the respective school districts entitled thereto shall be in addition to and without regard to any assistance to such school districts from any other sources in maintaining the minimum educational program and minimum

transportation program.

(2) In counties wherein special road districts have been created according to law, the board of county commissioners shall distribute a proportionate share of the 66 2/3% of the total amount received for the general road fund to such special road district or districts within the county based upon the percentage that the total area of such road district bears to the total area of the entire county.*

NEW SECTIONs. Section 2. Use of forest reserve money by school districts. (1) The school district portion of forest reserve money may be retained, accumulated, and expended for the purchase of school sites and for the construction and remodeling of school buildings by the trustees of the respective school districts.

(2) When, within the discretion of the trustees of the respective school districts, forest reserve money is not needed for projects authorized in subsection (1) the money may be expended for current expenses.

Section 3. Section 20-9-331. MCA. is amended to read:

program. (1) It shall be the duty of the county
commissioners of each county to levy an annual basic tax of
25 mills on the dollars of the taxable value of all taxable

state foundation program support. The revenue to be collected from this levy shall be apportioned to the support of the foundation programs of the elementary school districts in the county and to the earmarked revenue fund, state equalization aid account, in the following manner:

- (a) In order to determine the amount of revenue raised by this levy which is retained by the county, the sum of the estimated revenues identified in subsections (2)(a) through (2)(f)(e) below shall be subtracted from the sum of the county elementary transportation obligation and the total of the foundation programs of all elementary districts of the county.
- (b) If the basic levy of 25 mills produces more revenue than is required to finance the difference determined above, the county commissioners shall order the county treasurer to remit the surplus funds to the state treasurer for deposit to the earmarked revenue fund, state equalization aid account, not later than June 1 of the fiscal year for which the levy has been set.
- (2) The proceeds realized from the county's portion of the levy prescribed by this section and the revenues from the following sources shall be used for the equalization of the elementary district foundation programs of the county as prescribed in 20-9-334, and a separate accounting shall be kept of such proceeds and revenues by the county treasurer

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 262 removes forest reserve funds from the foundation program and allocates them to the various school districts within a county.

ASSUMPTIONS:

The amount of forest funds will remain constant at \$3,142,793 per year.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Currently, \$3,142,793 of forest funds flow into the foundation program each year. Under the proposed law, these funds would go directly to the districts and could be used outside the foundation program.

A decrease in Foundation Program revenues either (1) results in a decrease in the Foundation Program schedules, (2) requires additional support from other contributors to the Foundation Program (oil and gas royalties, corporation license tax, individual income tax, State General Fund appropriation, etc.), or (3) requires a state deficiency levy.

LOCAL IMPACT:

School districts in affected areas would have \$3,142,793 more money above the Foundation Program.
