AMENDING SECTION 20-3-208, MCA."

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24 25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 20-3-208. MCA+ is amended to read:

"20-3-208. Authority to request, accept, and disburse

moneys money. (1) A county superintendent may, with the

advice and consent of the appropriate school boards, request

and accept moneys money made available from federal+ state+

or private sources for purposes of public education in-those

districts—which—do-not-employ—a-district-superintendent-or

other-districts.

(2) Subject to applicable federal and state guidelines and, in the case of moneys money received from private sources, subject to any guidelines fixed by the donor, a county superintendent may, in his discretion, disburse moneys money received under this section to one or more of the public elementary and or high school districts which—do not—employ—a—district—superintendenty according to their needs. The county superintendent shall supervise the

1 utilization of such moneys money with the approval of the appropriate school boards.

(3) The county superintendent may establish a fundfor which the county treasurer shall maintain a separate

5 accounting, for the deposit of moneys money received under

6 this section.
