INTRODUCED BY BOOK TO ALLON INCREASED

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO ALLON INCREASED

REGULAR AVERAGE NUMBER BELONGING PAYMENTS FOR HIGH SCHOOL

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS; PROVIDING A METHOD OF

CALCULATION; INCLUDING INDUSTRIAL ARTS COURSES IN THE

FORMULA AT A DECREASED RATE; AND AMENDING SECTION 20-9-313.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Calculation of additional regular ANB for vocational education. Additional average number belonging for high school vocational education programs is computed in the following manner:

- (1) The total number of board of public education approved vocational education periods offered by a high school district on October 1 of the previous year is divided by the total number of board of public education approved periods offered by the district on October 1 of the previous year.
- (2) The total number of pupils enrolled in the high school district as of October 1 of the previous year is multiplied by the percentage derived in subsection (1).
- (3) To determine the additional average number

belonging entitlement for high school vocational education
programs that may be used in the preparation of the high
school district's following year budget as allowed under
20-9-319, the high school vocational average number
belonging calculated under subsections (1) and (2) must be
multiplied by 0.3.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Minimum number of pupils for vocational education period. The board of public education shall establish the minimum number of pupils for a vocational education period according to the size of the high school district. If a period does not meet the minimum size established by the board of public education, the period must be reimbursed at a lower percentage, to be determined by the board of public education, than a period that meets the minimum standard.

NEW_SECTIONs Section 3. Additional regular ANB for industrial arts programs. Board of public education approved industrial arts programs are included in the provisions of [section 1] at a level equal to 50% of the additional regular annual number belonging authorized for vocational education programs.

Section 4. Section 20-9-313, MCA, is amended to read:

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calculated in accordance with the ANS formula prescribed in 20-9-311, may be increased when:

- (1) the opening of a new elementary school or the reopening of an elementary school has been approved in accordance with 20-6-502. The average number belonging for such school shall be established by the county superintendent and approved, disapproved, or adjusted by the superintendent of public instruction.
- branch of the county high school has been approved in accordance with 20-6-503, 20-6-504, or 20-6-505. The average number belonging for such high school shall be established by the county superintendent's estimate, after an investigation of the probable number of pupils that will attend such high school.
- number belonging due to the closing of any private or public school in the district or a neighboring district. The estimated increase in average number belonging shall be established by the trustees and the county superintendent and approved, disapproved, or adjusted by the superintendent of public instruction no later than the fourth Monday in June.
- 24 (4) a district anticipates an unusual enrollment 25 increase in the ensuing school fiscal year. The increase in

- average number belonging shall be based on estimates of increased enrollment approved by the superintendent of public instruction and shall be computed in the manner prescribed by 20-9-314.
- established under 20-7-117(1), the ANB to be used for budget purposes is the same as one-half the number of 5-year-old children residing in the district as of October 1 of the preceding school year, either as shown on the official school census or as determined by some other procedure approved by the superintendent of public instruction;
- (6) a special full-time pupil, as defined in 20-9-311, in a given school year will no longer be considered a special full-time pupil in the ensuing school year (the superintendent of public instruction may grant one ANB for such pupil for the ensuing school year); or
- (7) a high school district provides early graduation for any student who completes graduation requirements in less than eight semesters or the equivalent amount of secondary school enrollment. The increase shall be established by the trustees as though the student had attended to the end of the school year and shall be approved, disapproved, or adjusted by the superintendent of public instruction.
- (8) a high school district provides a board of public

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- 1 education approved vocational or industrial arts education
- 2 program. Regular average number belonging must be increased
- 3 according to the provisions of [section 1]."
