BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 20-3-201, MCA, is amended to read:
#20-3-201. Election and qualifications. (1) A county

superintendent shall be elected in each county of the state unless a county manager form of government has been organized in the county. The county superintendent shall be elected at the general election preceding the expiration of

17 the term of office of the incumbent.

- 18 (2) Any person shell—be is qualified to assume the office of the county superintendent who:
 - (a) is a qualified elector:
- 21 (b) holds a valid teacher certificate issued by the 22 superintendent of public instruction; and
- 23 (c) has not no less than 3 years of successful 24 teaching experience as a certified teacher or 25 administrator:

1 Idl holds a master's degree in school administration
2 from a unit of the Montana university system or an
3 equivalent institution; and

(e) holds an appropriate class 3 administrative certificate as provided in 20-4-106, except that he is not required to possess both an elementary and a secondary instruction endorsement."

NEW_SECTION. Section 2. Emergency variance certain requirements. (1) Upon application of any qualified elector residing within the county, the superintendent of 10 11 public instruction may, pursuant to quidelines adopted by 12 the board of public education, grant an emergency variance from the requirements of subsections (2)(d) and (2)(e) of 13 14 20-3-201 for that county whenever those requirements present an unreasonable obstacle to the securement of a county 15 superintendent for that county. 16

- 17 (2) The board of public education shall adopt rules in 18 the nature of guidelines to be followed by the 19 superintendent of public instruction in granting or denying 20 such emergency variances.
- 21 (3) An emergency variance is valid only for the term 22 of office of the county superintendent who takes office 23 pursuant to that variance.
- NEW SECTION. Section 3. No application to existing county superintendents. The requirements of subsections

- 2 superintendents who take office by election or otherwise
- 3 after July 1, 1979.
