A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REINSTITUTING A SCHOOL CENSUS OF CHILDREN 6 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER AND UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE AND A CENSUS OF CHILDREN UNDER 6 YEARS OF AGE; DEFINING ELIGIBILITY; PROVIDING COMPENSATION FOR ENUMERATION OF CHILDREN; PROVIDING FOR REVIEW AND TRANSMITTAL; AND AMENDING SECTION 20-3-325, MCA."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. School census. The trustees of each elementary district must annually take a school census of all children residing in the district who are 6 years of age or older but who have not yet reached their 21st birthday. At the time the school census is taken, the trustees also must take a census of all the children residing in the district who are less than 6 years of age. The school census shall be taken between September 15 and Uctober 15, but the age of the child or the residence of the child or parents shall be determined on the basis of his age or the residence on October 1.

NEW SECTION: Section 2. Census contents. The school census and the under-6-years-old census shall report the following facts:

- (2) the full names of both parents or guardian and the address of the parents or the quardian; and

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Child eligibility. For the purpose of the school census and under-6-years-old census:

(1) a child is a resident of a district when:

- 11 (a) he resides with his parent or legal guardian in 12 the district:
 - (b) he has resided in the district but is temporarily living outside of the district to attend a public or private school, an institution of higher education, or a Montana public institution and his parent or legal guardian resides in the district;
 - (c) he is married or has been married and resides in the district, regardless of the residence of his parents or legal guardian;
 - (d) he is living at a private institution focated in the district that exists primarily for the rehabilitation, psychiatric, or general medical care or general welfare of the child and such private institution may or may not also provide education for the child; or

(e) he resides in the district and is not specifically excluded under subsection {2}.

- (2) a child is not a resident of a district when:
- (a) he is visiting in or passing through the district;
- (b) he is living in the district for the purpose of attending a public or private school or institution which exists primarily for the purpose of providing elementary, secondary, or higher education and his parent or legal quardian does not live in the district:
- (c) he is an unmarried child who is living in the district but his parents do not reside in the district and he is not living in a private institution, as defined in subsection (1)(b); or
- (d) he may be properly included on the school census of some other district.
- NEW SECTION. Section 4. Report of school census and under-6-years-old census. The school census and the under-6-years-old census for a district must be reported in alphabetical order by the child's last name on the blanks supplied by the county superintendent and prescribed by the superintendent of public instruction, unless the superintendent of public instruction authorizes a district to submit its census by a data processing tabulation.
- NEW SECTION. Section 5. Compensation. The clerk of the district or any other person who enumerates the children

- of the district for the school census or under-6-years-old census is entitled to be paid at a rate not exceeding 10 cents per name properly reported.
 - NEW SECTION. Section 6. Review by county superintendent. (1) A county superintendent must maintain and update with each school census and under-6-years-old census an alphabetical card index for all the families of the county with each child of the family listed on the family card.
- 10 (2) When the county superintendent of a county
 11 receives the school census and the under-6-years-old census
 12 from a district as prescribed by [section 7], he must:
 - (a) examine the school census and under-6-years-old census reports of each district for:
- 15 (i) duplication of a child's name on the reports of
 16 separate districts;
 - (ii) fictitious names:
- 16 (iii) the names of children who are too old or too 19 young for inclusion on the report on which they are listed; 20 or
- 21 (iv) names of children who were not residents of the 22 district on October 1 in accordance with the terms of 23 residence prescribed by [section 3];
- (b) notify the reporting district of any errors orduplications and delete the names of the children that he

has questioned unless the reporting district satisfactorily explains within 15 days the inclusion of the questioned children on its report.

NEW SECTION: Section 7. Transmittal. (1) The person conducting the census shall submit two copies of the reports, under oath, to the trustees who in turn shall submit them to the county superintendent by November 1.

- (2) After the county superintendent has completed his examination of each district's school census and under-6-years-old census reports and not later than December 1. he must submit the reports to the superintendent of public instruction.
- (3) The superintendent of public instruction must issue a receipt for the reports to the county superintendent when a complete report for each district of the county is received.

Section 8. Section 20-3-325, MCA, is amended to read:

#20-3-325. Clerk of the district. As provided in

20-3-321, the trustees shall employ and appoint a clerk of
the district. The clerk of the district shall attend all

meetings of the trustees to keep an accurate and permanent
record of all the proceedings of each meeting. If the clerk
is not present at a meeting, the trustees shall have one of
their members or a district employee act as clerk for the
meeting and such person shall supply the clerk with a

certified copy of the proceedings. The clerk of the district
also shall be the custodian of all documents, records, and
reports of the trustees. Unless the trustees provide
otherwise, the clerk shall:

- (1) keep an accurate and detailed accounting record of
 all receipts and expenditures of the district in accordance
 with the financial administration provisions of this title;
 and
- 9 (2) prepare the annual trustees* report required under
 10 the provisions of 20-9-213(5)*: and
- 11 (3) make an annual census of all the children of the
 12 district in accordance with fractions 1 through 71.*
