Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to amend travel reimbursement rates providing increased reimbursement for personal aircraft use.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The number of air miles flown by personal aircraft in FY 1978 was approximately 31,000 miles.
- 2. There is no reason to believe a major increase will occur in FY 1980 or FY 1981.
- 3. There will be no increase in the 17¢/mile allowed for personal cars.
