BY REQUEST OF THE LEGISLATIVE AUDIT COMMITTEE

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF THE FIELD OF PLUMBING BY A BOARD OF PUBLIC SAFETY IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION; TERMINATING THE OPERATION OF THE BOARD OF PLUMBERS ON JULY 1, 1979; ELIMINATING REFERENCES TO THE BOARD OF PLUMBERS; CLARIFYING DEFINITIONS RELATED TO PLUMBING; GRANTING RULEMAKING AUTHORITY; IMPOSING DUTIES ON THE DEPARTMENT; PERMITTING MASTER PLUMBERS TO WORK AS JOURNEYMAN PLUMBERS; PERMITTING THE BOARD TO SET FEES; AMENDING SECTIONS 2-8-121, 37-69-101, 37-69-301, 37-69-304 THROUGH 37-69-308, AND 50-60-204, MCA; AND REPEALING SECTIONS 2-15-1655 AND 37-69-201 THROUGH 37-69-203, MCA."

WHEREAS, the sunset law, sections 2-8-103 and 2-8-112, will terminate the board of plumbers and require a performance evaluation of the board by the legislative audit committee; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the performance evaluation, the legislative audit committee recommends that the board of plumbers be abolished and regulation of the field of plumbing be transferred to the board of public safety in the

department of administration and that certain statutory
provisions be amended or repealed.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 2-8-121. MCA, is amended to read:

"2-8-121. Effect of termination. Upon Unless otherwise
provided: upon termination, each agency or unit shall
continue in existence until July 1 of the next succeeding
year for the purpose of winding up its affairs. During the
windup period, termination does not reduce or otherwise
limit the powers or authority of each respective agency
except that no action may be taken which would continue in
effect beyond the 1-year windup period. Upon the expiration
of the 1 year after termination, each agency not modified or
reestablished shall be abolished and all unexpended balances
of appropriations, allocations, or other funds shall revert
to the fund from which they were appropriated or, if that
fund is abolished, to the general fund."

Section 2. Section 37-69-101. MCA, is amended to read:
#37-69-101. Definitions. Unless the context requires
otherwise, in this chapter the following definitions apply:

- (1) "Board" means the board of plumbers-provided for in [section 1 of Senate Bill 247].
- (2) "Department" means the department of professional

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(3) "Orainage system" means all the piping inside the malls of a building that conveys sewage or other liquid mastes outside the building to the building sewer but that does not extend more than 2 feet outside the building ways (3)(4) "Field of plumbing" means the business, trade, or work having to do with the installation, removal, alteration, or repair of plumbing and drainage systems or parts thereof.

457(6) "Master plumber" means a person who is authorized by this chapter to plan, estimate, bid, contract for, and supervise plumbing work.

(7) "Plumbing system" means all potable water supply and distribution pipes. all plumbing fixtures and traps. all drainage and went pipes. and all building drains. including their respective joints and connections. devices, receptacles. and appurtenances within the property lines of the premises and potable water piping. water heaters. and yents for the same.

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Rulemaking power. The board shall adopt rules to regulate the field of plumbing as are necessary to protect the public health, safety, and welfare.

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Duties of the department. The

14 (1) assist the board in the transaction of its business and keep a record of the board's official actions;

(2) charge the board for the reasonable costs of the department incurred in assisting the board;

(3) In conjunction with carrying out inspections of plumbing installations for code compliance as set forth in Title 50, chapter 60, part 5, inspect licenses to insure compliance with this part and advise the board in writing of any license violations; and

(4) report any plumbing code or licensing violations discovered by state or local building inspectors to the board in writing.

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Section 5. Section 37-69-301, MCA, is amended to read:
#37-69-301. License required temporary exception by
municipal resolution when licensed plumber not available.
Any person working at the field of plumbing in any
incorporated city, town, or in any other area served by a
public water supply or a public sewer system in this state.
either as a master plumber or as a journeyman plumber, or
who while working at the field of plumbing shall connect
plumbing to or disconnect plumbing from a public water
supply or public sewer system shall first secure a state
license as hereinafter provided. The council or commission
of any city or town or board of directors or managers of a
water or sewer district or water utility, in cases where a
duly licensed person or persons are not reasonably
available, may by ordinance, rule, or resolution duly
adopted and upon reasonable notice to the board ofplumbers
and upon their approval, authorize the practice in the field
of plumbing by a person or persons who have not obtained the
state licenses as hereinafter provided until such time as a
duly licensed person or persons are reasonably available.*
Section 6. Section 37-69-304, MCA, is amended to read:
#37-59-304. Qualifications of applicants for
journeyman plumber's license restriction on authority.
(1) The following requirements shall be met by applicants
for a journeyman nlumber's license:

(a) a specific record of 4 years' experience in the field of plumbing of a character satisfactory to the board. This experience requirement may be fulfilled by working 4 years in a major phase of the plumbing business or by completing an apprenticeship program meeting the standards set by the department of labor and industry or the United States department of labor, bureau of apprenticeship, or credit towards this experience requirement may be given for time spent attending an accredited trade or other school specializing in training of value in the field of plumbing and approved by the board.

- (b) satisfactory completion of an examination conducted by the department, subject to 37-1-101(4) with the approval of the hoard, testing the applicant's knowledge of techniques and methods employed in the field of plumbing and establishing by practical demonstration his competence in the special skills required in the field of plumbing.
- (2) A licensed journeyman plumber may perform work only in the employment of a licensed master plumber unless otherwise permitted by rule of the board.

Section 7. Section 37-69-305, MCA, is amended to read:
#37-69-305. Qualifications of applicants for master
plumber's license -- restriction on authority. (1) The
following requirements shall be met by an applicant for a
master plumbers' license:

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(a) evidence of 4 years' experience as a journeyman plumber in the field of plumbing of a character satisfactory to the board;

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- (b) evidence of 3 years* experience in supervisory capacities in the field of plumbing, which may run concurrently with the requirement in subsection (1)(a);
- (c) satisfactory completion of an examination for master plumbers testing his knowledge of the field of plumbing and demonstrating his skill and ability in the field of plumbing.
- (2) A master plumber is-not-outhorized-to may perform the work of a journeyman plumber-unless-he-is-siso-licensed as-a-journeyman-plumber.
- (3) A master plumber shall not allow his license to be used by any person or firm corporation or business other than his own for the purpose of obtaining permits or for doing plumbing work under his license."
- Section 8. Section 37-69-306, MCA, is amended to read: #37-69-306. Examination -- issuance of license. (1) An applicant for a license to work in the field of plumbing shall be examined as to his qualifications by the department, subject-to-37-1-181(4) with the approval of the board. The department shall examine each applicant for a license to determine his skill and qualifications as a master plumber or journeyman plumber.

- 1 (2) The applicant, upon successfully passing the examination prescribed by the board, shall be issued a license authorizing him to engage in the field of plumhing as a master plumber or journeyman plumber in the state of Montana.
 - (3) In the case of a firm or corporation, the examination and issuance of a license to an individual of the firm or to a principal of the firm or corporation satisfies the requirements of this chapter as to master plumbers but not as to journeymen plumbers. No individual. firm, or corporation may do the work of a master plumber unless licensed under this chapter."
 - Section 9. Section 37-69-307, MCA, is amended to read: #37-69-307. Examination fee and annual renewal fee. (1) No applicant for a master plumber's license may submit to the examinations prescribed by the board until he has deposited with the department \$180--es an examination fee established by the board, and no applicant for a journeymen plumber's license may submit to the examination prescribed by the board until he has deposited with the department \$50 as an examination fee established by the board.
 - (2) A license when issued expires 1 year from the date of issuance. A license issued to a master plumber or a journeyman plumber may be renewed annually without examination, at any time prior to its expiration, by a

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written request for its renewal directed to the department and the payment of-not-to-exceed-\$100 as set by the board for a renewal of a master plumber's license and not-to exceed-\$25 as set by the board for a journeyman plumber's license. Renewal is for the period of 1 year.

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- (3) Fees established by the board pursuant to this section must be reasonably related to the costs incurred by the board in carrying out its specific functions.

 - #37-69-308. Deposit of fees. Money paid for license fees under this chapter shall be deposited in the earmarked revenue fund for the use of the boardy---subject---to 37-1-101(6).*
- 15 Section 11. Section 50-60-204. MCA, is amended to 16 read:
 - #50-60-204. Public hearing required. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, no rule, amendment, or repeal of the state building code may take effect until after a public hearing by the department.
 - (2) If a hearing has been held by the state fire marshal with respect to his duties contained in chapter 3 of this title or by the board of plumbers public safety, the department of health and environmental sciences, the board of warm air heating, ventilation, and air conditioning, or

the state electrical board on a proposed rule relating to
building and equipment standards in their respective fields.

a public hearing by the department is not required.

Section 12. Transfer of funds. All unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations, or other funds of the board of plumbers shall be transferred to the board of public safety on July 1, 1979, to be used for the purpose of regulating the field of plumbing.

Section 13. Transition. All orders and rules relating q to the regulation of the field of plumbing made by the board 10 of plumbers remain in effect until revoked or modified in 11 12 accordance with law by the board of public safety. The records and documents of the board of plumbers are 13 14 transferred to the board of public safety. All licenses, 15 permits, and certificates issued prior to July 1, 1979, remain valid under the same terms and conditions as when 16 issued and are subject to the provisions of Title 37, 17 16 chapter 69.

Section 14. Effect of termination. The provisions of 20 2-8-121 do not apply to the board of plumbers.

Section 15. Codification. It is intended that sections
3 and 4 be codified as an integral part of Title 37. chapter
49. and the provisions of Title 37. chapter 69. apply to
54. sections 3 and 4.

In compliance with a written request received February 7, 1979, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for Senate Bill 385 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

SB 385 transfers the functions for the Board of Plumbers to the Board of Public Safety to be created under the Department of Administration. In addition, it lays out the duties of the Board as they relate to the plumbing field as well as laying out the licensing guidelines.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- The duties of the Board of Plumbers will be assumed by the Board of Public 1. Safety on July 1, 1979.
- 2... The work load after the transfer will remain the same.
- ⁷3. The budget and staff needs will remain the same.
- The Montana Executive Budget 1980-1981 for the Board of Plumbers will, therefore, 4. remain legitimate for the Board of Public Safety.

FISCAL IMPACT:

None.

COMMENT:

This board, currently under the Department of Professional and Occupational Licensing, contributes to the Centralized Services Program for services performed for the Department. The elimination of these funds could increase the amount contributed by the remaining boards not scheduled for sunset at this time.
