 17 shall thereupon be empowered to levy such tax, to be
 18 collected as other taxes on personal property and when
 19 collected to be deposited by the county treasurer in a
 20 special fund to be known as the stockmen's special deputy
 21 fund, together with any other funds made available from
 22 county, state, federal, or private sources for the purposes
 23 of this part."

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO CHANGE THE MAXIMUM LEVY USED TO SUPPORT COUNTY LIVESTOCK PROTECTIVE COMMITTEES OR DISTRICT CATTLE PROTECTIVE COMMITTEES FROM 25 CENTS TO 50 CENTS PER HEAD; AMENDING SECTIONS 81-6-104, 81-6-204, AND 81-6-209, MCA."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 81-6-104, MCA, is amended to read:
"81-6-104. Tax levy -- special fund. Said county livestock protective committee may recommend to the board of county commissioners the levy of a tax in an amount not to exceed 25 50 cents per head on all assessable cattle in the county on January 1, and the board of county commissioners shall thereupon be empowered to levy such tax, to be collected as other taxes on personal property and when collected to be deposited by the county treasurer in a special fund to be known as the stockmen's special deputy fund, together with any other funds made available from county, state, federal, or private sources for the purposes of this part."

Section 2. Section 81-6-204, MCA, is amended to read:
"81-6-204. Tax levy -- deposit of proceeds. Said

district cattle protective committee may recommend to the board of county commissioners the levy of a tax in an amount not to exceed 25 50 cents per head on all assessable cattle in the district on January 1, and the board of county commissioners shall thereupon be empowered to levy such tax, to be collected as other taxes on personal property and when collected to be deposited in the county treasury of one of the counties in the district, to be selected by the district cattle protective committee, in a special fund to be known as the stockmen's special deputy fund, together with any other funds made available from county, state, federal, or private sources for the purposes of this part."

Section 3. Section 81-6-209, MCA, is amended to read:
"81-6-209. Tax levy -- deposit of proceeds. Said district cattle protective committee may recommend to the board of county commissioners the levy of a tax in an amount not to exceed 25 50 cents per head on all assessable cattle in the district on January 1, and the board of county commissioners shall thereupon be empowered to levy such tax, to be collected as other taxes on personal property and when collected to be deposited in the county treasury in a special fund to be known as the stockmen's special deputy fund, together with any other funds made available from county, state, federal, or private sources for the purposes of this part."
