(1) Whenever any bank in the 13 state of Montana elects to remain closed and refrains from 14 the transaction of business on Saturday, pursuant to 15 authority for permissive closing on Saturdays by virtue of 16 the laws of the state, legal holidays for such bank during 17 18 the year of such election are hereby limited to the 19 following holidays:

23 (a) Each Sunday;

- 21 (b) New Year's Day, January 1;
- 22 (c) Nemorial Day, the last Monday in May;
- 23 (d) Independence Day, July 4;
- 24 (e) Labor Day, the first Honday in September;
- 25 (f) Thanksgiving Day, the fourth Thursday in November;

(g) Christmas Day+ December 25;
