Section 1. Section 7-4-4201, MCA, is amended to read: *7-4-4201. Salary of officers. (1) The council must by ordinance fix the salaries and compensation of the city officers, policemen, and other employees, which must not exceed the amount specified in this code.

- (2) The salary and compensation of an officer must not be increased or diminished during his term of office except as provided in 7-4-4605.
