BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 7-4-2504, MCA, is amended to read:

#7-4-2504. Salaries to be fixed by resolution. The
county commissioners shall by resolution, on or before July
1 of each year, fix the salaries of the county treasurer,
county clerk, county assessor, county school superintendent,
county sheriff, and county attorney and the clerk of the
district court for the following fiscal year in conformity
with the appropriate statutory salary schedule pertaining to
each office. The county commissioners of first— and
second-class counties may increase the county sheriff's
salary above the scheduled salaries provided in 7-4-2503.
The salary schedule used for each office shall be the
statutory schedule in effect on the first day of the
following fiscal year.**

- (b) clerk and recorder;
- (c) clerk of the district court;

- 11 (2) (a) Except as provided in subsection (2)(b) the 12 salary of no deputy or assistant shall be more than 90% of 13 the salary of the officer under whom such deputy or 14 assistant is serving.
 - (b) In fixing the compensation allowed the undersheriff, the board must fix the same at 95% of the salary of the officers under whom such undersheriff is serving.
