(1) It is 20 unlawful for any person to make or publish any false 21 statement or charge reflecting on any candidate's character. 22 morality. or integrity or which tends to injure or defeat 23 him at the polls. A person making such a statement with 24 knowledge of its falsity or with a reckless disregard as to 25 whether it is true or not is guilty of a misdemeanor. 1 (2) In addition to the misdemeanor penalty of 2 subsection (1), a successful candidate who is adjudicated 3 guilty of violating this section may be removed from office 4 as provided in 13-35-106 and 13-35-107.
