NON, THEREFURE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE

That the Legislative Committee on Priorities is а 9 requested to appoint a joint committee to conduct an interim study of the structure of Montana's state agencies with 10 special emphasis on the effectiveness of programs created 11 after 1970 and to determine if duplicative functions exist 12 13 within the agencies. The committee shall use the 14 recommendations of the executive reorganization report as a 15 starting point and shall evaluate the feasibility of 16 implementing at the present time the recommendations which 17 were not implemented at that time.

18 BE II FURTHER RESOLVED, that the committee propose 19 changes in the present structure of state agencies that 20 would promote efficiency and effectiveness in state 21 government. The committee's study shall be guided by the 22 principle that the taxpayers of Montana are entitled to 23 responsive, responsible service.
