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A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA TO REQUEST THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL AND REHABILITATION SERVICES FUND DAY-CARE SERVICES THROUGH TITLE XX OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT.

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WHEREAS, the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services of Montana has funded day-care services in the state in the past by means of funds obtained under Title XX of the Social Security Act; and

WHEREAS: the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services has proposed funding day-care services in the future by removing day care from funding under Title XX of the Social Security Act and providing such funding under Title IV of the Social Security Act; and

19 WHEREAS: such a policy would increase the financial 20 burden to Montana counties; and

WHEREAS, such a policy would cause adverse effects to the people of the state of Montana.

In compliance with a written request received ARCH 20, 19 79, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for Senate Joint Resolution 16 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION:

Senate Joint Resolution 16 would require the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services (SRS) to fund day care through Title XX of the Social Security Act.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- The per diem rate paid for day care is the same for Title XX and Title IV-A (AFDC).
- 2. The Title IV-A day care costs are those proposed by the Human Services Subcommittee.
- 3. No federal funds are available to match additional day care expenditures in Title XX.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There would be no change in expenditures under SJR 16, but the source of funds would change as follows:

TECHNICAL NOTE:

The SRS Assistance Payments program currently allows for day care payments to be included in the AFDC grant if the recipient works a night shift or for some other reason cannot place his/her child(ren) in a licensed day care center. Continuation of this policy would be prohibited by SJR 16.
