A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA BRIGING THAT THE FINANCIAL PLIGHT OF LINCOLN SCHOOL DISTRICT IN LEWIS AND CLARK COUNTY BE EVALUATED BY CERTAIN PUBLIC INTEREST GROUPS. THE STATE OF MONTANA. AND THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AND A SATISFACTORY SOLUTION BE ACHIEVED IN ORDER TO PROVIDE THE EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES FOR SUCH SCHOOL DISTRICT NECESSITATED BY DESTRUCTION BY FIRE OF FORMER FACILITIES AND TO PROVIDE FUTURE ASSISTANCE TO SIMILARLY SITUATED SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS, Lincoln School District in Lewis and Clark County is deeply in need of educational facilities as a result of destruction by fire of the former facilities utilized for educational purposes; and

WHEREAS, the cost of construction of replacement facilities may exceed \$500,000; and

WHEREAS, the tax base of the school district is such that only \$380,000 could be generated under the school district's borrowing capacity because of the following factors:

24 (1) Lincoln School District contains 669 square miles of land, of which 82% is owned by the federal, state, or

local governments, and the remaining 18% is owned by the private sector:

- (2) the assessment value of all private property in Lincoln School District is \$1,323,081, which provides a borrowing capacity of \$384,693, including the existing indebtadness of \$4,000; and
- (3) the school district share of United States Forest Service funds generated by timber sales, grazing fees, ·land-use fees, recreation charges, utility fees, mineral revenues, and admission and user fees on Mational Forest Service land is negligible, as evidenced by the school district receipt of \$500 out of a recent \$49,000 United States Forest Service payment to Lewis and Clark County; and

WHEREAS, the population of the school district greatly warrants educational facilities within the school district. there being 759 permanent residents, including 186 children who are 18 years of age or younger, in 1977; and

WHEREAS, the degree of isolation of Lincoln School District from adjacent school districts with adequate educational facilities necessitates construction educational facilities within Lincoln School District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE 23

24 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

That the financial plight of Lincoln School District in

Lewis and Clark County be evaluated by the state of Montana and the federal government and a satisfactory solution be achieved in order to provide replacement facilities for the educational facilities destroyed by fire in Lincoln School District and to provide future assistance to similarly situated school districts which, because of inadequate tax bases, are incapable of independently financing needed educational facilities.

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24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the citizens of this state be urged to offer assistance through mometary contribution to Lincoln School Districts
