 4    A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF  
 5    REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA ASSIGNING THE  
 6    REVENUE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INTERIM STUDY OF  
 7    THE VARIOUS ASPECTS OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE REGULATION IN  
 8    MONTANA.

 10        WHEREAS, the Legislature has established a  
 11        comprehensive system to regulate and limit the manufacture  
 12        and sale of alcoholic beverages; and

13        WHEREAS, the amount of revenue received from sales in  
 14        state liquor stores and from taxes on alcoholic beverages  
 15        and license fees is significant to state and local  
 16        governments; and

17        WHEREAS, the public interest demands that the  
 18        Legislature take responsible action to alter certain aspects  
 19        of the system to meet today's marketing conditions; and

20        WHEREAS, there have been increasing efforts in the  
 21        Legislature evidenced by the many bills introduced to alter  
 22        laws governing the marketing of alcoholic beverages and the  
 23        licensing of retail outlets; and

24        WHEREAS, the people have recently adopted by initiative  
 25        a law altering the marketing system for table wine; and

1                    WHEREAS, piecemeal changes in this system may have  
 2                    unexpected repercussions damaging to consumers, wholesalers,  
 3                    retailers, and the state; and

4                    WHEREAS, responsible legislation can be more  
 5                    effectively developed through study and deliberate  
 6                    consideration by the Legislature.

 8                    NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE  
 9                    OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10                    That the Revenue Oversight Committee is assigned to  
 11                    study all aspects of alcoholic beverages regulation,  
 12                    including marketing, licensing, and quotas and the probable  
 13                    effects of changes that have been proposed. The Committee  
 14                    shall make its recommendations no later than September 15,  
 15                    1980, and submit its report and recommendations together  
 16                    with implementing legislation to the 47th Legislature.
