A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA TO ESTABLISH AN INTERIM LEGISLATIVE IMPROVEMENT COMMITTEE TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF REVISING THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE STRUCTURE. 7 ASSIGNING CERTAIN OVERSIGHT FUNCTIONS TO THE COMMITTEES, AND 8 LIMITING THE NUMBER OF BILLS WHICH MAY BE INTRODUCED AFTER 9 10 THE BEGINNING OF THE LEGISLATIVE SESSION.

WHEREAS, there has been a significant increase in the volume of legislation considered by each succeeding Legislature in the past decade, with more than 2,000 legislative drafting requests being made in the 46th Legislature; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature finds it necessary to streamline certain current procedures in order to more effectively consider such proposed legislation.

NOW. THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

- (1) That an interim legislative improvement committee 23 be appointed to study: 24
- 25 (a) the committee structure, in each

Legislature to determine the feasibility of realigning general areas of responsibilities and assigning legislative

oversight responsibilities to the committees;

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- (b) methods of limiting the number of bills requested to be drafted and requiring the drafting of legislation prior to the commencement of the legislative session.
- (2) That the committee shall use House Joint 7 Resolution No. 46 introduced in the 46th Legislature as a basis for its study.
 - (3) That the committee be composed of two senators appointed by the President of the Senate, two senators appointed by the Senate Minority Floor Leader, two representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and two representatives appointed by the House Minority Floor Leader.
 - (4) That the committee may meet not more than three times during the interim preceding the 1981 legislative session. Necessary travel expenses of the committee shall be paid from the appropriation contained in House Bill No. 1 of the 46th Legislature to the Legislative Council for legislative travel, after approval as provided therein.
- 22 (5) That the committee shall present 23 recommendations to the pre-1981 session caucus, together 24 with a draft of any proposed rules or amendments to joint rules necessary to implement the recommendations. It is 25

intended that the rules committees appointed at or following
the presession caucuses meet jointly prior to the convening
of the 1981 session to consider the recommendations and to
present such proposed rules or amendments as they approve to
the 47th Legislature upon commencement for adoption on the
first legislative day, along with other rules proposed for
temporary adoption.
