Senet JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 39 1 INTRODUCED BY Sector 2 By request of the Senate Taxation Committee 3 A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF 4 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA DIRECTING THE 5 DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE TO REVIEW ITS ADMINISTRATIVE RULES 6 7 REGARDING THE APPRAISAL OF MOTOR VEHICLES FOR PROPERTY TAX PURPOSES. 8 9 WHEREAS, the Department of Revenue is currently using 10 11 the "high book value" shown in national sales guides in 12 valuing motor vehicles for property tax purposes; and WHEREAS, the "high book value" is not appropriate in 13 determining the value of motor vehicles owned by a taxpayer 14 15 since it contains sales reconditioning costs and dealer 16 profit margins; and 17 WHEREAS, use of the "high book value" increases the tax

18 on older vehicles because the reconditioning and markup 19 costs are higher on this type of vehicle; and

20 WHEREAS, the owners of older vehicles are often elderly 21 and low-income persons who are least able to pay high 22 property taxes; and

23 WHEREAS, the values shown in national sales guides do
24 not always reflect the authentic value of motor vehicles.

1 NDW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE 2 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NONTANA:

That the Department of Revenue is directed to review 3 its administrative rules regarding the appraisal of motor 4 5 vehicles, including cars, pickups, trucks, recreational vehicles, farm trucks, and equipment including industrial 6 7 and mining equipment, snowmobiles, motorcycles, boats, 8 airplanes, and other motorized vehicles, and to use values 9 that more truly represent the value of motor vehicles owned 10 by a taxpayer than does the "high book value".
