11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

13       Section 1. Section 81-2-103, MCA, is amended to read:  
14       "81-2-103. Adoption of rules. The department shall  
15       adopt and enforce rules for the inspection and tuberculin  
16       test testing of dairy cattle or other animals and for the  
17       inspection, test testing, treatment, or disposition of  
18       livestock or other animals affected with or which may have  
19       been exposed to infectious, contagious, communicable, or  
20       dangerous disease and for the quarantines provided for in  
21       this chapter or 81-20-101."


In compliance with a written request received 1-9, 19 81, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for H.B. 107 pursuant to Chapter 53, Laws of Montana, 1965 - Thirty-Ninth Legislative Assembly. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 107 ammends 81-2-103 MCA to require the adoption and enforcement by the Department of Livestock of rules for the inspection, testing, treatment, or disposition of animals other than livestock affected with or which may have been exposed to disease.

COMMENT:

House Bill 107 will have no fiscal effect on the Department of Livestock because the functions will be performed by veterinarians in private practice.

## STATEMENT OF INTENT

HOUSE BILL 107

Committee of the Whole

5 A Statement of Intent is required for this bill because  
6 it grants rulemaking authority to the Department of  
7 Livestock.

8       Under the present law, the Department of Livestock may  
9       adopt rules for the inspection, testing, and treatment of  
10      certain diseases in livestock. The diseases in question can  
11      sometimes affect animals which are not normally categorized  
12      as livestock and can spread from those animals to livestock.  
13      The intent of this legislation is to allow the Department to  
14      adopt rules for the inspection, testing, and treatment of  
15      these other animals to prevent spreading of the disease.
