HOUSE BILL NO. 131

INTRODUCED BY

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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO REQUIRE NATIONAL
GUARD ARMORIES TO KEEP A STOCK OF BLANK AMMUNITION FOR USE
IN FIRING SALUTES TO DECEASED VETERANS."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Ammunition for burial salute. Each Montana
national guard armory shall keep in stock at all times no
fewer than 50 rounds of blank ammunition of a caliber
suitable for firing a salute of honor at the burial of any
deceased veteran of the United States military forces who is
entitled by law or regulation to such honor.

Section 2. Codification instruction. This act is
intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 10,
chapter 2, part 5, and the provisions of Title 10, chapter
2, part 5, apply to this act.

Description of Proposed Legislation


House Bill 131 required National Guard Armories to maintain a stock of blank ammunition in the Armory for use in Military funerals.

Assumptions

1. Free issue of blank ammunition is available from the National Headquarters of the Veterans of Foreign Wars. Local Post may order supplies as needed without charge. The assumption is made that this organization will supply the ammunition to be stored as provided for in the bill.
2. The bill is asking the National Guard for storage space only, and not implying that the National Guard assume all Honor Guard Duty for each community where a Guard unit is located. The National Guard will provide Honor Guard when possible.

Fiscal Impact

There is no fiscal impact upon the department. The providing of storage space would be without charge.
