A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE POWERS
AND DUTIES OF THE MENTAL DISABILITIES BOARD OF VISITORS;
AMENDING SECTION 53-21-104, MCA."

BE IT FNACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 8 Section 1. Section 53-21-104, MCA, is emended to read: 9 "53-21-104. Powers and duties of mental disabilities 10 board of visitors. (1) The board shall be an independent 11 board of inquiry and review to assure that the treatment of 12 all persons either--voluntarily-or involuntarily edmitted 13 committed to a mental facility is humane and decent and 14 meets the requirements set forth in this part. 15

16 (2) The board shall review all plans for experimental research involving persons admitted involuntarily committed 17 to a mental health facility to assure that the research 18 project is humane and not unduly hazardous and that it 19 20 complies with the principles of the statement on the use of human subjects for research of the American association on 21 22 mental deficiency and with the principles for research 25 involving human subjects required by the United States 24 department of health, education, and welfare. No 25 experimental research project involving persons admitted <u>involuntarily committed</u> to a mental health facility affected
 by this part may be commenced unless it is approved by the
 mental disabilities board of visitors.

4 (3) The board shall at least annually inspect every mental health facility which is providing treatment and 5 evaluation to any person pursuant to this part. The board 6. 7 shall inspect the physical plant, including residential, £ recreational, dining, and sanitary facilities. It shall visit all wards and treatment areas. The board shall 9 10 inquire concerning all treatment programs for individuals involuntarily committed to the facility being implemented by 11 12 the facility.

13 (4) The board shall annually insure that a treatment 14 plan exists and is being implemented for each patient 15 admitted-or committed to a mental health facility under this 16 part. The board shall inquire concerning all use of 17 restraints, isolation, or other extraordinary measu :s.

18 (5) The board may assist any patient at involuctarily
19 <u>committed_to</u> a mental health facility in resolving any
20 grievance he may have concerning his commitment or his
21 course of treatment in the facility.

(5) The board shall employ and be responsible for
full-time legal counsel at the state hospital, whose
responsibility shall be to act on behalf of all patients at
involuntarily committed to the institution. The board shall

-2- INTRODUCED BILL //B 133 insure that there is sufficient legal staff and facilities to insure availability to eff such patients and shall require that the appointed counsel periodically interview every such patient patients and examine his their files and records. The board may employ additional legal counsel for representation of such patients in a similar menner at any oth r mental health facility having inpatient capability.

(7) If the board believes that any facility is failing 8 9 to comply with the provisions of this part in regard to its 10 physical facilities or its treatment of any a committed 11 patient, it shall report its findings at once to the professional person in charge of the facility and the 12 13 director of the department, and if appropriate, after 14 waiting a reasonable time for a response from such 15 professional person, the board may notify the next of kin or 16 guardian of any patient involved, the friend of respondent appointed by the court for any patient involved, and the 17 18 district court which has jurisdiction over the facility.

19 (8) The board shall report annually to the governor 20 and shall report to each session of the legislature 21 concerning the status of the mental health facilities and 22 treatment programs which it has inspected."

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
