HOUSE BILL NO. 158 1 INTRODUCED BY <u>Lonation fund</u> Meyou 2 Vincont Hiering 3 Nilliams A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE 4 BOARD OF PUBLIC EDUCATION SHALL ORDER THE SUPERINTENDENT OF 5 PUBLIC INSTRUCTION TO DISTRIBUTE THE STATE EQUALIZATION AID 6 7 TO EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT IN FIVE INSTALLMENTS EACH SCHOOL YEAR; AMENDING SECTION 20-9-344, MCA.* 8

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10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 20-9-344, MCA, is amended to read: 11 "20-9-344. Purpose of state equalization aid and 12 13 duties of the board of public education for distribution. 14 (1) Except as provided in 20-9-345, the moneys available for 15 state equalization aid shall be distributed and apportioned to provide an annual minimum operating revenue for the 16 elementary and high schools in each county, exclusive of 17 13 revenues required for debt service and for the payment of any and all costs and expense incurred in connection with 19 any adult education program, recreation program, school food 20 21 services program, new buildings, new grounds and 22 transportation.

(2) The board of public education shall administer and
distribute the state equalization aid in the manner and with
the powers and duties provided by law. To this end, the

1 board of public education shall:

2 (a) adopt policies for regulating the distribution of
3 state equalization aid in accordance with the provisions of
4 law;

(b) have the power to require such reports from the
county superintendents, budget boards, county treasurers,
and trustees as it may deem necessary; and

8 (c) order the superintendent of public instruction to 9 distribute the state equalization aid on the basis of each 10 district's annual entitlement to such aid as established by the superintendent of public instruction. In ordering the 11 12 distribution of state equalization aid, the board of public 13 education shall not increase or decrease the state equalization aid distribution to any district on account of 14 15 any difference which may occur during the school fiscal year 16 between budgeted and actual receipts from any other source 17 of school revenue. <u>The order shall require the</u> 18 superintendent of public instruction to distribute the 19 state_equalization_aid_to_each_district_in_five_installments 20 each_school_year_with_one_installment_due_on_each_of_the 21 following__dates: August_31. October_1. January_30. February 22 28. and March 30.

(3) Should a district receive more state equalization
aid than it is entitled to, the county treasurer must return
the overpayment to the state upon the request of the
