9 department head as defined in 2-15-102 may pay a cash award  
10 to an employee whose suggestion or invention contributes to  
11 the efficiency, economy, or other improvement of state  
12 government by reducing the costs of government operations.

13 (2) The amount of the cash award must equal 10% of the  
14 savings resulting from implementing an employee's suggestion  
15 or using his invention for 1 year up to a maximum payment of  
16 \$25,000. The department head shall pay the employee from the  
17 department's budget in a single, lump-sum award. This award  
18 is in addition to the recipient's regular compensation.

19 (3) Acceptance of the cash award under this section  
20 constitutes an agreement that the use by the state of an  
21 idea, method, or device for which the award is made does not  
22 form the basis of a further claim of any nature against  
23 state government by the employee or his heirs.

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Description of Proposed Legislation


An act to permit incentive/cash awards to a state employee whose suggestion or invention reduces the cost of state government.






